MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

Elections for the new parliament in Ireland under the Irish Home Rule Bill were carried out yesterday, but only in the north of Ireland were ballots cast. As the nominations for the South Irish parliament were made without contest and the candidates were virtually elected by acclamation. Attacks were made at one of the Belfast booths on anti-partition voters and several persons were stabbed and beaten. Two policemen who came to the rescue also were beaten. Trouble was also started in Belfast when Protestants held a demonstration near St. Matthew's Catholic church, though little damage was done. In Montreal, yesterday, several thousand people paid homage to the memory of Father Deltord, one of the figures of Canadian history. Many societies and organizations placed wreaths at the foot of the Deltord monument in Lafontaine Park.

In official circles in Washington, yesterday, it was announced that there were under consideration the establishment of a confederation of British America, to include Canada, some of the West Indies and British Guiana. It was said in Ottawa that such a project was not being considered.

THE PREMIER AT FREDERICTON

Fredricton, May 24.—About 8,000 people from Fredericton and the surrounding districts attended the political meeting in the interests of R. B. Hanson, the Conservative candidate, held in the Arctic rink on Monday night. The speakers were F. B. Stacey, M. P. of Chatham (N. B.), and Right Hon. Arthur Meighen, prime minister of Canada. The speakers were given an attentive hearing. The meeting was one of the largest of its kind ever held in this city. J. D. Palmer was chairman.

BRITISH HISTORY IS DEPICTED IN FINE PAGEANT

The pageant consisting of tableaux, depicting scenes from British history, which was presented on the afternoon of Empire Day in the Imperial Theatre by the ten primary chapters of the I. O. D. E., proved highly successful and was among the most pleasing observances of the day. The spirit of history in the person of Miss Portia MacKenzie, introduced each tableau by recounting the episode which it portrayed. The tableaux were artistically staged and were made doubly effective by the gorgeous coloring as well as the historical accuracy of the costumes. Each chapter presented a tableau and the series marked the progress of the Empire from the time of the Romans until the accession of Queen Victoria to the throne. The funts will go towards the I. O. D. E. memorial scholarship.

Miss Verta Roberts gave explanatory recitations between some of the tableaux and gave them with fine patriotic feeling. Miss Louise Knight sang "Canada My Home," which many of her audience heard for the first time. It is an appealing melody and was most sympathetically rendered. Thomas Guy's solo was "The Land of Hope and Glory" and he sang it with splendid effect. Master Victor Regan sang "Plymouth Sound" pleasingly.
