### NEWSPAPERMAN RESPONSIBLE FOR THE EVACUATION

Gallipoli Incident Regarding News Despatch is Told by Lord Northcliffe

London, July 22.—(Associated Press, by mail) Lord Northcliffe recently revealed an interesting bit of war history concerning the evacuation of Gallipoli. The hero of the story was Keith Murdoch, an Australian journalist, who is returning home to become editor of the Melbourne Herald, and the occasion of the telling of it was a luncheon given by Mr. Murdoch to the Times.

"It is an open secret," said Lord Northcliffe in proposing Mr. Murdoch's health, "that it was due to his initiative that the Australians and the rest were removed from Gallipoli. Coming to Europe for the first time he went to Gallipoli peninsula and for the first time the truth was revealed.

"He brought a dispatch, a very terrible dispatch which I believe was intended to be sent to Australia. He showed that dispatch to me and I suggested that he should not send it, but in carrying that dispatch record to the Antipodes could be better used for the purpose of immediate action.

"I asked him to take it to Lloyd George and one of the finest pieces of work the prime minister did in the war was to circulate the document to the whole cabinet, which then consisted of twenty persons. As a result of Keith Murdoch's dispatch immediate action was taken and that horrible story was concluded."

### PASSING OF CULT OF OMAR ANNOUNCED

Religious Organization was Founded in The Pas, Man., Last Spring.

The Pas, Man., Aug. 2.—The church of the Cult of Omar has expired. Founded on the Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam, a new religious organization was born in The Pas this spring. It sprang into sudden importance and only three of its original members would admit that they still held firm to their beliefs. The exclusive from membership started when a new convert made the statement that the whole affair was arranged with the object of getting the government permit to purchase liquor from the government store under the guise of its necessity for sacramental purposes. Officials of the cult deny that they had any such intention.

Many leading business and professional men of The Pas were members of the cult, and the movement had assumed an importance and standing that was thought to threaten the temporary disruption of the local churches. Ministers were alarmed and unwilling to read in local paper the names of the members of the Cult of Omar, some of whom were leading members of the orthodox denominations. Following the statement of the transient member as to the alleged purpose of the society, the movement collapsed rapidly.

### IMMATURE FRUIT IS PROHIBITED

Jamaica Passes Law Against Purchase and Exportation.

Kingston, Jamaica, Aug. 2.—The legislative council has passed a law prohibiting the purchase and exportation of immature fruit. The measure was the outcome of the keen competition between American companies purchasing and shipping bananas from Jamaica and other British West Indian islands.

The colonies of the British Indies have decided upon a uniform customs tariff. Arrangements are being made to give preference to Canadian goods, principally flour. In return, Canada is to give preference to West Indian products, chiefly sugar and oranges.

### GASOLINE SHOULD COST 25 C. LESS IN CANADA

At a meeting in Montreal last week of the Automobile Club of Canada, the price of gasoline was discussed at length. It was pointed out that in Montreal and Toronto gasoline costs 90 per cent. more than it does in Detroit and other American cities. From inquiries made by the club it was disclosed that in Detroit gasoline sells for 20 cents a gallon for some brands, and at 21 cents for others. In Montreal the retail price for one grade is 37 cents and 4 cents for another. Calculations were then made to show the local price should be about 25 per cent. less than it is, even after making allowances for loss on exchange, freight, government taxes, and the difference between the American and the Canadian gallon.

### REJECTS HONOR OF KING'S COUNSEL

W. D. Gregory of Toronto States Reasons in Letter to Hon. W. E. Rane.

(Toronto Mail and Empire)

W. D. Gregory has addressed the following letter to the Hon. W. E. Rane: "My dear Rane: I see that my name is in the list of those whom the Chief Justice of Ontario, Sir William Mulock, and Mr. John Hoskin recommend to you for appointment as King's Counsel. I have long left that no more appointments of King's Counsel should be made and I trust that in declining the appointment, I must do, I shall not seem guilty of any discourtesy to yourself or to the eminent men who have placed my name upon the list and whom I hold in high personal regard.

No duties are attached to the office of King's Counsel, and it appears to me that no public interest requires the making of such appointments. There is no fixed standard for determining to whom the title should be given. There is bound to be dissatisfaction and discontent whatever the composition of the list may be.

I feel strongly that the practice of giving certain barristers precedence over others in the courts by making them King's Counsel is undesirable and out of harmony with the democratic standards that generally prevail in Canada. It seems to me that there is no place where precedence over their fellows any more than that official precedence should be given to certain men in other professions or callings.

Canadians would not of themselves create the office of King's Counsel. It had not its origin in Canada and has not its roots in our soil. When we brought over our political institutions from the old land we brought with the good timber some dead wood, and the office of King's Counsel was part of the dead wood.

Precedence there always will be in the office of King's Counsel, but it is the precedence that we all consciously or unconsciously give to high character and high ability. This is real precedence and to me seems the only precedence that is desirable and worth while.

### ADRIAT FOUR DAYS WITHOUT ANY FOOD
