BLACKMAILING OF ACTRESS ADMITTED

Ex-convicts Sentenced For Demanding \$10,000 on Pain of Death.

NEW YORK, May 12.—Confessing that they wrote Mrs. Frances M. Nelson, a motion picture actress, a letter threatening her life if she did not send them \$10,000, two ex-convicts were each sentenced to the penitentiary for one year.

Mrs. Nelson gave Judge Mancuso the following letter which she had written at Maloney's suggestion March 31 last:

"Consider this letter carefully if you value your life. You are marked for death unless you pay \$10,000. A messenger boy will call Wednesday afternoon for it. Don't try any tricks. We have waited for six months and know all about you. If you phone the police we will kill you the first chance we get. We are giving you a chance to come across in a nice clean way. We are well organized and never fail. We will know the moment you notify the police. THE GANG WHO NEVER FAILS."
