We truft we may fay, that our Session has been both pleasant and profitable. Our Assemblies were large, and in general solemn. The LORD enabled his Servants to preach faithfully the pure, but too much neglected Doctrine of the Crois, and they were sent home with power to the hearts of the people.

To us it appears that this is an eventful time : but, "a fparrow cannot fall to the ground without our Father, and the very hairs of our heads are all numbered." We wilh to follow peace with all Men, and holinets, without which no man fhall fee the LORD.

It is our foul's defire to fee that happy day, when fwords fhall be beat into plough fhares, and fpears into pruning hooks; when Nation fhall not lift up fword against Nation; and when they fhall learn the direful art of war no more. Then fhall the Kingdoms of this world become the Kingdoms of our LORD, and his CHIST, and he fhall reign for ever and ever.

We have been refreshed by your Correspondence and Messengers. May the LORD remove every unfavourable thing out of the way that is calculated to prevent our mutual friendship.
