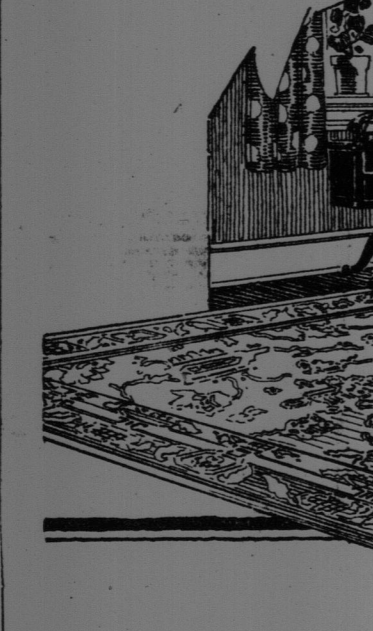

Mrs. Warren of Banff Has Made Scientific Study of Flora of Rockies.

New York, March 17—"I could never pose as an intrepid explorer," declared Mrs. William Warren of Banff, Alberta, Canada, the explorer who is here in the interests of the Rocky Mountain Tourist Company.

She herself colored many of the pictures she had taken on the trails, and made them into lantern slides, which were shown to the wounded in English and Canadian hospitals.
