The Mission School has prosperously maintained its own, under an average staff of *twenty* Office-bearers and Teachers, of which *five* gentlemen and *three* ladies are associated with St. Paul's Church. The number of scholars on the roll was 197, being 105 boys and 92 girls. The number of scholars in average attendance was 120, being 62 boys and 58 girls. Sunday collections were \$74.71. The teachers continued with moderate success their weekly meetings for the combined study of the lesson.

The four Annual Festivals, none of the expenses of which encroached upon the annual grant, met with their usual success :—Soiree, 3rd March ; Ice-cream Festival, 20th June ; Picnic to Highgate Springs, 19th August ; Christmas Gathering, 21st December.

The classes were closed during the months of July and August, but a "Children's Service" among the older scholars was maintained, and an average attendance of *fifty* was considered encouraging.

A "Juvenile Sewing Society," for instructing the girls in useful stitching, has been lately attempted, and deserves the encouraging presence of the ladies of our congregation. The meetings are held in the chapel on each Saturday afternoon. The Librarians distributed, each Sunday since the opening of the new Library, about seventy-five volumes. These and the illustrated monthly periodicals were eagerly enquired after ; and it is suggested that a praiseworthy individual missionary effort could be carried out by some member of our congregation placing these monthly papers in the hands of the children. The yearly cost is about fifty dollars.

The Finance Committee of the School, after much prayerful and industrious effort during the past thirty months, have at length succeeded
