## REPORT ON SABBATH SCHOOLS.

We have in the Niagara Annual Conference, as reported to us 96 schools, with an attendance of 5.041 pupils, conducted by 790 officers and teachers, and also 101 Bible classes. In these schools there are 12,870 volumes and 318 papers. The expenses during the year, \$866.37 Conversions, 137. We regret that there is not a greater increase in our Sabbath Schools.

Our confidence in the S School work for the salvation of souls ought to stimulate us to renew our energy and to commit ourselves
