THIRD WITNESS (Cont'd):

Gnr. Lecompte went down and as Bdr. Waterfield and I picked him up, I noticed a little blood on his face which looked as though his nose was bleeding. Bdr. Waterfield asked me to help take Lecompte to the guard room and I carried his feet with Bdr. Daniels and Bdr. Waterfield at each arm.

This witness was cross-examined by the Accused:

- Why didn't you arrest me when I started to argue with L/Opl. Richmond?
 A. I have nothing to do with the kitchen and it was

FOURTH WITNESS:

H-40921 L/Opl. Richmond, N.A., RCASC, att, A-1, CATC, CA, having been duly sworn, states as follows:-

I am the cook in charge of the kitchen L-ll, and on the evening of March 10th, Gnr. Lecompte came in to talk to me and we sat around talking for quite a lengthy time. I was on duty cooking meat for the next day. We had been telling jokes and apparently something I said arnoyed Gnr. Lecompte. He grabbed hold of me and we both landed on the floor in a wrestling hold. We were both talking loudly, and the noise attracted two Birs. to come in to investigate. They were Bir. Waterfield and Bdr. Daniels.

When the two Bdrs. came in they told Onr. Lecompte to leave me along. The grief, that Gnr. Lecompte had shown against me then shifted to the Bdr. Bdr. Waterfield ordered Gnr. Lecompte to his hut but he wouldn't go. Then Bdr. Waterfield told him he was under arrest. Gnr. Lecompte resisted arrest although I didn't see him as I turned to the ovens to look at the meat I had roasting. The next I saw of Gnr. Lecompte was when he was walking between the two Bombardiers going out of the door.

We had been to the wet canteen earlier in the evening and had been drinking but we were not drunk. I can make no further statements regarding the injuries Onr. Lecompte received.

The Accused cross-examined this witness:

- Q. Did you tell Bdr. Waterfield not to take me to the guard room?
- A. I left it entirely to the Edr. and didn't say anything about it.
