Denver to appear before the Supreme Court in a habeas corpus proceeding was met at the Denver depot by Secretary Haywood and Captain Wells of the militia, which is Captain Wells' best. Major was made a brutal attack upon Secretary Haywood, because the two brother unionists attempted to shake hands. Haywood promptly knocked his assailant down and was at once set upon by soldiers of the guard, who, after bayoneting and clubbing him, took him into custody and refused to surrender him to the civil authorities when officers of the law responded to the riot call caused by the strike. Press despatches would indicate that negotiations of Colorado are under way, but nothing is known and that the civil authorities are apparently helpless while Governor Peary and General Bell are holding the reins.

The Toronto Casket Company, Mr. Moyers' company, by the way, has advanced the cost of the necessities of the workers and tenants up the rent of their new buildings, which they do not purpose to use for some time. Labor does a criminal act in raising wages at this time, but it is good business for the manufacturer, the landlord and the merchant to put their prices as high as possible. The papers which are so solicitous about labor not making a mistake should investigate the other side and show our crimes before attacking the under dog.

Rev. Washington Gladdens, writing of the Colorado situation, tells some interesting things of the land of liberty as follows: It is evident that there is a reign of terror in Teller county and that the terrorists are not all miners. The worst practices of the turbulent workingmen are outlined by these friends of "law and order." I talked with one of the exiles and he is, I am told, one of the leading merchants of Teller. He ride a man worth \$50,000, but a strong sympathizer with the miners. He is a socialist, but a non-resident, as he told me. He said he had never before been arrested, and had never given or received a blow in his life. He is a mild-mannered man and there were tears in his eyes when he told me his story. He was seized in his home by a delegation of the "law and order" forces, who broke down his doors. He was about retiring and was in his stocking feet, when he was dragged from his home through snow and frozen puddles of water to the "bull pen," and thence to the railway station. His wife brought him his shoes before he was taken away. On the way to the train he was beaten over the head with the butt of a pistol by his captors, inflicting an ugly scalp wound. Such are some of the methods by which it is proposed to restore order, and to establish training classes by the boys would be better employed spent in the baths learning to swim.
