The resignation of Mr. George P. Young, of the city of Sandon, as a coroner for the province of British Columbia is accepted.

The Nelson license district is defined as follows: All that portion of the Nelson Riding Electoral District, not included in any municipality to be known as the Nelson license district. Such license district to come into existence on the 28th day of May, instant.

Thursday, May 26th, is proclaimed a public holiday throughout the province. Under section 1 of the Rivers and Streams Act, Charles Cummings, of Grand Forks; E. Spraggett, of Grand Forks; Richard Armstrong, of Rossland; and H. S. Cayley, of Grand Forks, are authorized to enter into and upon the land of any person who may be willing along or adjacent to the North Fork of Kettle River, and to survey and take levels and make examinations for proposed improvements in clearing and removing obstructions from the river, and for making it fit for rafting and driving thereon logs, timber and lumber under and subject to the provisions of the act.

THE SIGN OF THE SCALES. Magistrate Hall has a Rebuke for the Colonist.

Before delivering judgment on the Reeves case this morning, Magistrate Hall said that he felt obliged to refer to an item which appeared in Sunday morning's Colonist dealing with the case and entitled 'A Youthful Knifer.'

The chief replied he had told a Colonel reported something about the case, but he certainly did not tell him all that the offending item contained.

The bench continued: The publishing of such an item was a most improper act—it was more—it was libellous, and it was full of inaccuracies. The statements therein contained were not borne out by the evidence. Besides, evidence which was rejected by me in court should not have been given to the public. Such evidence was rejected upon legal grounds, because it was not properly admissible, and a report such as the one to which I have referred was not only an improper but a dangerous act.

Chief Sheppard: "That's what the report did not emanate from. The part of it was all emanated from the reporter's own head, and was wrong."

The Court: "What I object to is publishing an item which is not accurate; which contains statements not put in evidence, and which seemed to me emanated by me only in reference to this statement. Chief Sheppard was not allowed to introduce evidence that twice before Reeves had displayed an amateurish fondness for the knife, and that the knife was being used in a dangerous manner. The chief: 'I didn't say that. I said it couldn't go in evidence.'"

The Court: "I don't care whether you can prove it or not. What I want to say is that before a decision is rendered upon an item is very mischievous and improper. Then the item says that Reeves struck at the other boy's neck, and that is not borne out by the evidence."

Chief Sheppard: "That's what the boy said." The Court: "It is not what he swore to." Chief Sheppard: "That's what he told me." The Court: "Is not his statement on oath, and that is what I must be governed by. The whole item is a peculiar one, and the 'A Youthful Knifer,' are particularly peculiar and dangerous."

After some words between the chief and the boy's father, the magistrate, after severely admonishing the boy, said, taking into account that no malice had been shown, and looking upon the case from a legal standpoint, he felt obliged to dismiss it.
