2,995 PERSONS KILLED

And 24,447 injured on U. S. railways in three months.

WASHINGTON, May 20.—Defective railroads in the United States were responsible for the death of 2,995 persons and the injury of 24,447 persons in the three months ending March 31, 1912.

The figures are the latest published by the Interstate Commerce Commission, and show a marked increase over the figures for the same period in 1911.

The Commission's report shows that the number of deaths on the railways in the three months ending March 31, 1912, was 2,995, as compared with 2,800 in the same period in 1911.

The number of injuries was 24,447, as compared with 23,000 in the same period in 1911.
