Platform of the United Farmers of N. S. 1. Whereas a call to the United Farmers of the different local branches for the putting up independent candidates to represent the different constituencies both in the Federal and Local houses and that the responses have been practically unanimous in its favor, therefore we, the officers and directors of the United Farmers, au-thoring the organizing director of each county to call a convention for the purpose of selecting candidates for both Federal and Local houses.


HOW THE PRIZES WILL BE AWARDED
