



Bloemfontein, Thursday, April 5-(De-layed in transmission)—The Royal Irish Rifles had been marching in the eastern part of the Free State, collecting arms and were returning to Bethany Tuesday when they were intercepted by x Boer commando, which had placed three guns in position. The Irish entrenched them selves while the mounted infantry scouted along both flanks, only to find escape im-possible. The Boers opened with guns and rifle fire. The British replied sparingly with rifle fire, husbanding their cartridges in the hope that help would arrive. Gradu-ally the Boers drew into closer quarters. 




