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ACADIA MINE WORKERS LOSE THEIR STRIKE Go Back to Work on Company's Terms After Losing Nearly \$15,000 in Wages.

Halifax, N. S., April 24.—The strike in the Acadia mine at Westville (N. S.), has been settled. There was a conference between the manager and the men this evening and as a result the men will go to work in the morning.

The terms of settlement are that the man Reid, on whose account the strike took place, is to have a job overground. This was the original offer of the company, but was not then accepted.

The amount of business which the company has had to hand over to other companies during the strike would have given in wages \$12,000 to \$15,000.
