

PERRY, STANISLAUS FRANCIS. (*Prince, P.E.I.*)

Descended from a French Acadian family. B. at Tignish, P.E.I., 1823. Ed. at St. Andrew's Coll., P.E.I. M., 1847, Miss Margaret Carroll. Represented Prince District in the P.E.I. Assem. from 1854, almost uninterruptedly, until Jan. 1874, and was Speaker of the Assem. from 1873 until 1874. Has also sat in the Ex. Council of P.E.I. An unsuccessful candidate for Prince in House of Commons, Sept. 1873. Returned to Commons at g.e. 1874; defeated at g.e. 1878. Re-elected to Ho. of Assem. 1879, and again at g.e. 1882 and 1886. Resigned 1887 and was re-elected to the Commons at g.e. 1887. A Liberal.—*Tignish, P.E.I.*

PLATT, JOHN MILTON, M.D. (*Prince Edward.*)

Grand parents came from Duchess Co., State of New York, about 1790, and settled in Hallowell, Co. of Prince Edward, when that district was in a state of nature. B. in the Tp. of Athol, Co. of Prince Edward, in 1840. Ed. at Fort Edward Institute, N. York State, the Normal Sch., Toronto, and Victoria Coll., Cobourg, at the last of which he graduated M.D. M., 1872, at Hallowell, a dau. of the late Arthur Branscombe, Esq., whose parents came from N.B. Was a Public School Inspector for ten years; is a graduate of the Military School, Toronto (1866), and is Surgeon to the 16th Batt. V.M.. Was the first editor and publisher of the *Picton New Nation*, which subsequently merged into the *Times*. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1882, and re-elected at g.e. 1887. This election being declared void he was re-elected 10 March, 1888. A Liberal.—*Picton.*

POPE, Hon. JOHN HENRY, P.C. (*Compton.*)

B. in Eastern Townships, P.Q., in 1824. Ed. at the High Sch. in Compton. Engaged in agricultural pursuits in early life. Is Presdt. of the International Railway of Maine, and of the Compton Colonization Soc.; one of the Trustees of the St. Francis Coll., Richmond, P.Q.; and a dir. of the Eastern Townships Bank. Commanded the Cookshfire Volunteer Cavalry for many years, and retired, retaining his rank as Major, 1862. Sworn of the Privy Council, and was Minister of Agriculture from 25 Oct., 1871, until 5 Nov., 1873, when he retired with Sir John A. Macdonald, on the Pacific Railway Question. Apptd. Minister of Agriculture 17 Oct., 1878. Apptd. Minister of
