

ARMSTRONG, *Lieut.-Col. Hon. DAVID MORRISON, J.P.* [*Saurel.*]

S. of the late Edmond Armstrong, Esq., formerly of the Royal Navy, who served during the American Revolutionary war, and was for many years Harbor Master of Montreal, by Elizabeth Dunn, his wife. Grands. of a U. E. loyalist, who with his family migrated to Canada on the rebellion of the American Colonies in 1776. B. in the parish of Maskinongé, District of Three Rivers, 1805. Ed. there. M. Miss Deligny, dau. of Jacques Deligny, Esq., who represented Berthier in the L. C. Legislature for twenty years. Sat for Berthier in L. A., Can., from 1841 to 1851. Is Lieut.-Col. commanding 4th Batt. Berthier Militia, and a Commissioner of Small Causes. Was a mem. of the Leg. Council, Can., from Feb. 1855 until the Union. Appointed to present House, 1867.—*Sorel, P. Q.*

BEAUBIEN, *Hon. JOSEPH OCTAVE, M.D.* [*De la Durantaye.*]

BEAUDRY, *Hon. JEAN LOUIS. J.P.* [*Alma.*]

A Warden of the Trinity House, Montreal, and Major 1st Montreal Centre Reserve Militia. Has been Mayor of that city. Contested Montreal unsuccessfully at g. e. 1854 and in 1858. Called to L. C., 1867.—*Montreal.*

BRYSON, *Hon. GEORGE.* [*Inkermann.*]

Was an unsuccessful candidate for Pontiac, in L. A., Can., at g. e. 1857. Appointed to Leg. Council, P. Q., 1867.—*Chichester, P. Q.*
