and who is to be buried on shore, where there is a fort, minute guns are to be fired from the ship whilst the body is conveying to the shore; and after the body is landed, minute guns are to be fired by the fort whilst the funeral procession is moving from the landing-place to the place of interment: the minute guns both from the ship and the fort shall not exceed twice the number of guns the Officer was entitled to when living.

Cannon are not to be fired at the funerals of Officers subordinate to the above ranks, it being left to the two services to regulate the salutes of the small arms, and other ceremonies to be observed at their funerals.
