Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th Instant, reporting an offer of 25 cents per cord, made by Captain Mongrain, for 1,000 cords of dry wood, on the Clear Water Bay Reserve, No. 38A, and in reply to inform you that permits may be given to Indians of the Band, to cut and sell this wood.

If, however, the Indians will not cut it, or any part of it, you may sell 1,000 cords to Captain Mongrain, or others, subject to cash payment for it, before removal from the Reserve, and under sworn returns of measurement, and on the condition that no green trees shall be cut.
