Doughty, of No. 1 TC, paid a staff visit regarding auxiliary services. C.4392 F/O W.J. Farmer, of No. 1 TC, visited this Unit regarding armament practical exams. Course 91 graduated. Pilots: 78; Nav (b): 3; Navigators: 14; Bombers: 13; Flt. Engineers: 1; Wastage: 25. (2 AG's, 4 WAG's, 7 CT'd, 12 transfers) Total: 134	
	14 Jan 1944		C.780 W/C A.H. Loeff paid a staff visit and spent the day inspecting stores and in consultation with the Station Equipment Officer. C.7566 F/L E.W. Burnett posted to No. 1 TC, Toronto, effective 14 January 1944. Had been Station Adjutant for past 16 months. Five P.4 compasses arrived, which will make it easier to give instruction on compass deviation, etc.	
	15 Jan 1944		C.24352 P/O Bowle-Evans, P.N. TOS on posting from No. 1 OTS. BI-MONTHLY HOSPITAL REPORT 1st to 16th JANUARY 1944 (incl.) Hospital admissions for the period: Station Sick Quarters 7, Sherbrooke General 1, Niagara Military Hospital 1, No. 1 AGGTS, PQ, 1, No. 1 CNS, 1, Chorley Park Military Hospital, 1. No serious accidents during this period. Infectious diseases, nil. Health of Unit has been average. The Alumni Singers from Toronto presented an entertainment program in the auditorium which was well attended.	
	16 Jan 1944		An outdoor automatic signalling lamp has been installed on the flag-pole on the Admin Building for airmen to practice reading signals from Barrack windows or while moving about the Station.	
	17 Jan 1944		The Alumni Choir sang three sacred songs at the 0930 hours Protestant Church Parade. C.1529 S/L A.E. Jarvis, of AFHQ, visited the Station regarding Link Instructors. A second course of instruction of Link Aircrew Selectors commenced today, consisting of 12 officers selected by AFHQ. Course 96 commenced with 83 airmen and 2 officers, F/O F. Otten and F/L P.E. O'Neill. F/O Otten was a prisoner of war in Italy for 18 months, escaped and rejoined the Allies in Southern Italy.	
	18 Jan 1944		Lt-Colonel J.A. Mattress, of No. 1 TC, visited the Dental Clinic at this Unit.	
	19 Jan 1944		C.9895 F/L C. Cooper of No. 1 TC, paid a staff visit regarding Motor Transport. C.781 W/C W.G. Dever of No. 1 TC, paid a staff visit and spent the day inspecting and checking stores procedure. The new Volunteer Service Medal ribbons were received for all qualified personnel of the CDC attached to the Station.	
	20 Jan 1944		C.1119 W/C Anderson, DFC, arrived from No. 1 TC, at 1330 hours to act as President of a Board of Officers to take over the new Drill Hall Lean-to.	
	21 Jan 1944		C.40110 P/O L.J. Bishop TOS from No. 1 TC and attached to No. 1 Squadron. G/C M.M. Sisley, AFC, from AFHQ, and F/L W.M. Blackie, C.2414, DAFM from RCAF Stn. Trenton, visited this Unit at 0930 hours. A dance was held in the Drill Hall for station personnel.
