we should do nothing to antagonize Mr. Neville and his organization, but gain their co-operation, I nevertheless think that your Society would be the best one to lead the movement in so far as this is done by any body outside of the Government. With Sir William Mulock at the head of the Canadian Peace and Arbitration Society, his very exceptional knowledge of proceeding would be invaluable, and I feel quite sure that if Sir William would take the lead as the head of the Society you would be able to make effective headway in the case of peace, and also materially further the interests of your organization.

I might add that your action in this particular would be sympathetically viewed by the Government and might work out into an effective co-operation between the two. This, however, I would like you to regard as confidential, save as to the officers of your association.
