It will be secessary to inform wax the Indians that the number of Ties inthorized must not be exceeded, and that if they want to out next Summer and Winter another Resolution of the Band will be necessary, and that sworn Returns of the number made by each Permit-Holder at the close of the Winter must be made. The Indians should be told that Penders for these Ties will be invited at once and the successful tenderer will make reasonable advances to them as the work progresses. Payment in full will be made for Ties delivered, approved or acceptable properly piled on the right of way of the Canadian Pacific Railway.
