Sir:-

Referring to circular letter to you of the 29th
May, and your examunication of the 2nd. instant, I beg
to say that the Department does not desire you to make a
special trip to any of the reserves in your agency in
connection with crops soon, etc. and new land broken, as
referred to, in the circular. You should, whenever possible,
without incurring any additional expenditure, furnish information on this subject to Read-quarters, but the Department, as stated above, does not wish you to incur a special
trip in the matter. While the circular letter in question
relates in a measure to matters connected with your agency
it refers more particularly to returns from other Indian
agencies where information in regard to crops, etc. can be
procured readily without expense.
