Ottawa, July 10, 1918.

Sir,-

I have to request you to inform the Caughnawaga Indian Council that from time to time for many years past the Department has expended considerable sums of money in the maintenance of the highway across the Doncaster Indian reserve which is the property of the Caughnawaga band.

Another request has been received for the sum of \$600.00 to be expended in the maintenance of the road. The Department is not disposed to bear this expense and intends now and in the future to charge a just proportion of it against the funds of the Caughnawaga band. Under these circumstances, it is suggested that it will be in the interest of the band to surrender the reserve for sale and it is desired that the Council should immediately consider the matter.
