Memorandum

On file No. 27160-1, under date of 28th March 1928, Surveyor MacKay states, - I would also suggest the advisability of covering the Indian graves of the Redstone Indians by Survey. These graves are on the south side of the Chilcoten Road about 20 chains east of the East boundary of Redstone Flat I.R. The area surveyed by Mr. Ashdown Green, B.C.L.S. in 1909 does not cover all these graves and I understand has not been gazetted. I would suggest the cancellation on the ground of the old survey and that a new lot be surveyed to contain all the graves and to provide sufficient space for the future graveyard requirements of these Indians."-----
An area not exceeding 2 acres would cover the graveyard requirements of the Redstone Indians and, as the area required is part of a wide stretch of unsurveyed Crown Land of no agricultural value there could be no reasonable objection taken to the survey".

On the 7th April 1928, on file 27160-1, Mr. J.E. Umbach, Surveyor General for British Columbia, was requested to have this survey, together with survey of boundaries of Rich Bar Indian reserve No. 4 and Quesnel Indian reserve No. 1, made by any surveyor who went into that locality.

In letter of 5th April 1928, File 27160-1, Commissioner Ditchburn reports that Major MacKay will be in the Chilcoten and Cariboo country about the middle of May.
