MENTIONS IN DESPATCHES AND COMMENDATIONS. CERTIFICATES

Specimens of the Certificates for issue to such foreign subjects as are granted a Mention in Despatches or a Commendation, are attached. These awards to foreign subjects are not published in the London Gazette.

The Certificate is in the form of those issued in the United Kingdom to British subjects, the words "was published in the London Gazette" being replaced by "was placed on record", and the words "to record" by "to express".

Mentions in Despatches are granted as heretofore for gallantry and for good service and confined to operations against the enemy. The names and descriptions of the individuals mentioned or commended will be inserted in red in manuscript resembling the type in the printed document, the work being carried out in accordance with the arrangements already made for the Certificates for British subjects. Instructions for engrossing Certificates 13 to 17 will be given by the Central Chancery and for Certificates 18 to 24 by the Admiralty, War Office or Air Ministry, as the case may be.
