Sir

I have the honor to acknowledge the Receipt of your letter of the 14th ult^o: Conveying to me the sentiments of his Excellency the Governor in Chief that a Compliance With my request to be admitted to rights of Citizenship under the Existing Laws of the Province could not be granted, and altho' much I regret the circumstance, I should hope that Nothing contained in Law can exclude me from pursuing my Profession as a Physician. Should I, on examination, be found Competent for this purpose I beg leave to inclose a Petition to that Effect to His Excellency - Supported by Respectable Signatures Subjects of His Majesty -
