Q. 1. What time did you report the accused missing? *C. Kelly*
A. 1. About mid-night.

K53064 Pte G.J. McMurphy HQ 2 Cdn Inf Bde Def Pl having been duly sworn, states: On 1 Jun 41 I was due to go on guard at 2130 hrs. Between 2100 hrs and 2130 hrs we were playing checkers, and about the time I was supposed to go on guard Cpl Kelly came to me and said ~~he had not been able to find the prisoner~~. In the meantime I went on guard. When I came off guard he informed me that he had not been able to find the prisoner. Where and when did you last see the prisoner?

- Q. 1. The last time I remember seeing him was about 1900 hrs.
Q. 2. What was he doing?
A. 2. He was laying on the bed either smoking or reading, I can't remember exactly.
Q. 3. How many men were in the guard room at the time?
A. 3. There were four men off guard and the corporal.
Q. 4. After 1900 hrs you cannot say definitely ~~you saw the accused~~
A. 4. No, sir, not definitely.
