DEBS PLANS CAMPAIGN

COVERING 10,000 MILES

**Socialist Candidate Will Open
Long Tour in Chicago
August 30.**

Special Dispatch to "Globe-Democrat,"

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., July 25—Eugene V. Debs, Socialist candidate for president, will make a special train campaign which will involve 11,000 miles of travel and twice across the country. The first of 240 speech-making points will be Chicago, August 30. From there he will go to the Pacific Coast, and up and down the coast all cities will be visited. The route from the Pacific to the Atlantic will be as far south as Tennessee. All the larger cities on the Atlantic are on the schedule. From the Atlantic Coast the train will pass through New York state, Pennsylvania and Ohio into Indiana for several big meetings in Mr. Debs' native state with a closing meeting the night before election day perhaps in Indianapolis. The train will consist of a sleeping car, a coach and baggage car. The latter is to be filled with Socialistic literature, and expert distributors will be on the train to give this printed matter away at each stopping place. It is expected to restock the car at Seattle and again at some point on the Atlantic Coast.
