

Accented on the second syllable.

adorn, because (bĕ-kawz', not be-küz'), forlorn.

The sound **aw** is simple though represented by a digraph.

VIII.—ö, as in on.

30. Cost, gorge, loll, shone (not shōn), troth, was, chaps, (= jaws).

Doric, Georgics (Jör-jîks), gorgeous, horrid, hostage, laurel, ordeal, sorry, sort, nom'înative, cărol, orthoepy (ör-thō'-ĕ pî).

It is affected to say "Gawd" for God.

In the following avoid the sound of ö in old.

forehead, (fö'r-ĕd) forty, fortnight, holocaust, homage, jocund, knowledge (nöl'-ĕj), monad, nonage, rollocks, roster, solstice (söl'-stîs), sombre, extol, loll.

cochineal, dolorous, molecule (möl'-ĕ-kül), monody, monologue (mön'-ö-lög), orotund, porcelain (pörs'-lān), probity, sorcerer, solecism, portent (pör'-tĕnt), portend (pör'-tĕnd').

In the following avoid the sound of ũ.

bomb, comrade, donkey, grovel (gröv'-l), hovel (höv'-ĕl), hover, sovereign (söv'-ĕr-in), yonder, parasöl, ballot, sermon, baron.

31. The sound of **o** before **f**, **th**, or **s** in the same syllable and in -ough (-öf), though generally denoted by ö, is by many good speakers pronounced somewhat, though not quite, like **aw**, as in *broth, soft, cross, cough*.

IX.—ō, as in go.

32. Brooch, goal (not gool), groat, gross, scroll, sloth, yolk (yök), bowsprit (bö'-sprit), homely, ogle (ög'l), ogre (öger) only (not ũnly), onyx, phonic, tophet, trophy.

coterie(-rî), potable, vocable, nomenclature, Bowie knife (bö'ĕ).

Accented on the second syllable.

opponent, patrol, provocative, revolt.

In unaccented syllables.

bellow, borough (bü'r-ō), gallows -lōz), hollow, obey, omi'tallow, thrēshōld, thorough (thür'ō), in'-dō-lĕnt.

N.B.—Zō-öl'-ō-gy (not zoo-öl'-ō-gy).
