

Accented on the second syllable.

adorn, because (bĕ-kawz', not be-küz'), forlorn.

The sound **aw** is simple though represented by a digraph.

VIII.—ö, as in on.

30. Cost, gorge, loll, shone (*not* shōn), troth, was, chaps, (= jaws).

Doric, Georgics (Jör-jiks), gorgeous, horrid, hostage, laurel, ordeal, sorry, sort, nom'native, cărol, orthoepy (ör-thō'ĕ pĭ).

It is affected to say "Gawd" for God.

In the following avoid the sound of ö in old.

forehead, (fö'r-ĕd) forty, fortnight, holocaust, homage, jocund, knowledge (nöl'-ĕj), monad, nonage, rollocks, roster, solstice (söl'-stĭs), sombre, extol, loll.

cochineal, dolorous, molecule (mö'l'-ĕ-kül), monody, monologue (mö'n'-ö-lög), orotund, porcelain (pörs'-län), probity, sorcerer, solecism, portent (pör'-tĕnt), portend (pör-tĕnd').

In the following avoid the sound of ũ.

bomb, comrade, donkey, grovel (gröv'-l), hovel (höv'-ĕl), hover, sovereign (söv'-ĕr-in), yonder, parasöl, ballot, sermon, baron.

31. The sound of **o** before **f**, **th**, or **s** in the same syllable and in -ough (-öf), though generally denoted by ö, is by many good speakers pronounced somewhat, though not quite, like **aw**, as in *broth, soft, cross, cough*.

IX.—ō, as in go.

32. Brooch, goal (*not* gool), goat, gross, scroll, sloth, yolk (yök), bowsprit (bö'sprit), homely, ogle (ögĭ), ogre (ögĕr) only (*not* ünly), onyx, phonic, tophet, trophy.

coterie(-rĭ), potable, vocable, nomenclature, Bowie knife (bö'ĕ).

Accented on the second syllable.

opponent, patrol, provocative, revolt.

In unaccented syllables.

bellow, borough (bü'r-ö), gallows -löz), hollow, obey, omi'tallow, threshöld, thorough (thür'ö), in'dö-lĕnt.

N.B.—Zö-öl'-ö-gy (*not* zoo-öl'-ö-gy).
