PRAYERS.

A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, requiring the attendance of this House in the Council Chamber.

The Houfe having attended accordingly—

Mr. Speaker prefented to His Excellency a Bill "for raifing a Revenue in "this Province"—a Bill "for appropriating certain Monics for defraying "the expences of the Province"—and a Bill "for granting certain Sums for "repairing and laying out Roads"—and fpoke as follows, viz.—

" May it pleafe Your Excellency !

"THE Houfe of Affembly have paffed these Bills and have directed me to present them; humbly requesting your Excellency will be pleased to affent thereto.

"The House have been particularly attentive to the various important "objects recommended by your Excellency to their confideration. In the "discharge of this duty, they have provided for the payment of the Debts of "the Province; have provided for carrying on the Building for the accom-"modation of the General Assembly and the Courts of Justice towards com-"pletion; and have not failed to attend to that important object suggested to your Excellency by His Royal Highness the DUKE of KENT, of facili-"tating the communication by land from Halifax, through this Province, "to Quebec.

"These Grants have been made with the most liberal intentions, and as "far as the abilities of the Province will admit : And the House have the "fullest confidence that the Sums granted will be expended with all the "œconomy the general interests of the Province require."

And His Excellency was pleafed to give his Affent to the following Billsviz.--

An Act for raising a Revenue in this Province.

An Act for the rendering Justices of the Peace more fafe in the execution of their Office; and for indemnifying Constables and others acting in obedience to their Warrants.

An Act to repeal all the Acts now in force relating to Trefpass, and for making new regulations to prevent the fame.

An Act for the better fecuring the Navigation of Paffamaquoddy Bay within Deer Island.

An Act for the fupport and relief of confined Debtors.

An Act for erecting a Court-House and Gaol in the County of Westmorland, and for altering the Shire-town of the said County.

An Act to continue an Act made and passed in the thirty-fixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "an Act for regulating, laying out, and re-"pairing Highways and Roads, and for appointing Commissioners and Sur-"veyors of Highways within the scveral Towns or Parishes in this Province, "and for suspending for a limited time all the Laws now in force relating "to the same."

An Act for the further and better support of the Poor in the City of Saint John.

An Act for preferving the Bank of the River Saint John, in front of the Parish of Lincoln, in the County of Sunbury.

An Act to continue an Act, intituled, "an Act for preferving the Bank "of the River Saint John, in front of the Parishes of Maugerville, Sheffield, "and Waterborough."
