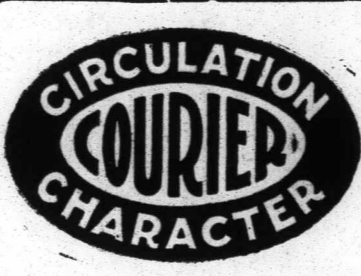

BRITISH RUSSIAN SOLDIERS PROTEST Desperate Res by Gern
Demonstrations in Pet grad Demand Resignation of Foreign Minister IS NOT IN SYMPATHY With View of Workmen and Soldiers, Reason Alleged
By Courier Leased Wire. Petrograd, May 4.—Via London. Detachments of soldiers have entered in front of the palace which used as the headquarters of the provisional government carrying flags with inscriptions demanding the resignation of Foreign Minister. The resignation of M. Milukoff was demanded by thousands of soldiers and workmen who marched streets yesterday afternoon and evening bearing banners with the slogan "down with Milukoff." Discontent has been smouldering for some time on account of the belief that the minister was not fully in sympathy with the viewpoint of the workmen and soldiers. The present outbreak which began yesterday was a direct result of the announcement made by the foreign office that the resignation of the minister would be considered. The resignation of M. Milukoff was demanded by thousands of soldiers and workmen who marched streets yesterday afternoon and evening bearing banners with the slogan "down with Milukoff."
