HYMNS NEVER USED.

A prominent member of Sherbourne Street church, Toronto, Mr. Richard Brown, fifteen years ago began to mark all the hymns that were sung we find a copy of the record kept by
Mr. Brown, and it furnishes some information of more than passing in terest. Mr. Brown has heard in all 3,700 hymns sung. His records show that of the hymns in the book 280 have not been used at all, 128 have been used once, and 103 twice, whilst the following hymns have been used twenty or more times:
