

Matter Dealt With

Ald. Farrell thought that City Marshal Roberts was an excellent man and fitted for this position as he would be already clothed with a certain amount of authority. He did not think that \$50 for the season would be too much for the position to remunerate him for spending the Sabbath days in ferreting out and bringing to justice any violators of the law. He moved that the salary of the official be placed at \$50 for the coming four months.

City Marshal Roberts stated that he did not wish to give up his Sabbath for the sum of \$50. He would rather give his services free and do his duty to the best of his ability, but the City Council might give him \$100 for the next six months.

Ald. Edwards thought it would be advisable to extend the time to six months, as the full months was the time when the services of the official in this capacity will be most required, and he was of the opinion that \$100 for the work would not be too much.

On motion the salary of such official was placed at \$100 for the season, and James Roberts, City Marshal, was appointed to such position.

Ald. Vanwart made an enquiry as to whose instructions the officer would perform his duties under.

Ald. Farrell stated that the officer would be a special constable and would act under the instruction of the Administration of Justice Committee.

Tenders for Band.

Ald. Farrell stated that as bill in connection with flats had been killed at Legislature it would not be proper for the city to secure a quantity of sand from the flats as in the past. He had therefore taken the liberty of calling for tenders for 400 tons of sand

to be delivered according to specification and had received two tenders for the sand, which he thought the Council might open and consider. One tender was from Wm. A. Clarke, who offered to supply 400 tons of sand from the Doherty property on University Avenue at 45¢ per ton. The other was from Michael Navill, at 40¢ per ton, the sand to be procured at the lower end of the city.

Ald. Farrell would hesitate to recommend the acceptance of the tender at such a price, which he considered very high. Nevertheless he would not be a party to procuring sand from the flats, and as it was a very scarce article at present, he thought perhaps the Council would be warranted in accepting Clarke's tender.

On motion of Ald. Moore the tender was accepted.

On motion of Ald. Edwards the meeting was adjourned until tomorrow evening at eight o'clock.
