The revival of interest in education, or rather the awakening of interest in this new field o education, has brought out much rivalry between the different cities as to which shall have the finest institutions for its young people. Nor is the attention and interest wholly or even mainly devoted to the material equipment. The effort is focussed on the boy and on the girl, particularly between the ages of fourteen and
