In the latest issue of the London "Nation" is an article by Bertrand Russell. He accompanied the British Labor delegation to Germany, though not a member of that body, and while they were being feted and made much of by the Bolshevists who wished to make the best impression possible, Mr. Russell went off "on his own" with a view of finding out the true condition of affairs.
