A MEETING of the subscribers to the capital stock of the Stratford and Huron Railway will be held in Stratford on August 25th, for the election of Directors.

The Senate of the University of London, established by the late Lord Brougham when he was simply a potential member of the House of Commons, was lately solicited by a majority of Convocation to apply for a new charter, with power to the University to admit women to degrees. The Senate declined such action by a majority of 17 to 10. Twelve years ago this question had been brought before the Senate and voted down by a majority of 1—the casting vote of Mr. George Grote, the historian of Greece, who was then Chancellor of the University.
