For the last 30 years the body of King George of Hanover has rested in George's Chapel, at Windsor, where it was brought for interment after his death in the French capital, owing to the fact that he was an English prince of the blood and a grandson of King George III. of England. Now it has been decided to transfer his remains to Gmunden, and to entomb them in the new Guelph mausoleum constructed by the Duke of Cumberland on the shores of Gmunden Lake, beside his Queen, who died a few weeks ago.
