With he exception of the years 1887 and 1888, when the Scott act was in force, the low water mark is reached in Ontario this year so far as the number of Jenkins Sign bars is concerned. Some idea of the decrease may be gained when one considers that in 1875 there were 4,79% bars and 1,307 liquor shops, while after May 1 there will be only about 1,800 hars and about 240 shops to cater to vastly increased population. At that period there will be 334 municipalities where the sale of liquor is illegal, and It is the avowed aim of the forces arrayed against the liquor interests to make a more extensive campaign this vear than ever before. In many parts of the country campaigns have been already started, and many important places, such as Peterboro, Brantford, Collingwood, Port Hope, Cobourg, Pic-
