FIFTEEN AUTOMOBILES IN WOLVERINE PARTY

Travellers Had Quite an Experience in a Storm Near Brantford.

Fifteen automobiles, touring in the affiliation run of the Wolverine Automobile Club, arrived in the city last evening from Toronto and Hamilton. The party left this morning for "Barbary."

Yesterday was the most strenuous day of the whole trip. On Thursday the party left Detroit, going around Lake Erie, by way of Toledo, Cleveland, Erie and Buffalo. They had good weather, the most part, and conditions were excellent for driving. Yesterday morning, however, they did strike a bad time, a terrible thunderstorm driving the whole party a strenuous half-hour.

Just after passing Brantford, the storm burst, causing many narrow escapes from serious accidents.

The worst experience was that of the press car, driven by Mortimer Roberts, a well-known Toronto man. The rainstorm had put the roads in bad shape, and when rounding a corner the machine skidded. Roberts sprang to the front for a stump brace into which it crashed, preventing the auto from turning turtle. The passengers were shaken up somewhat, but not seriously injured. The driver, being considerably bruised, the tender and manager of the machine were damaged somewhat, and the lamps were broken.

Mr. L. P. Morissette, driver of the baggage car, had an experience in the rain. He was driving the car, and the storm had been here for some time, and he was not used to it. As he did the lightning struck a tree about 10 feet from him, splintering it right down the centre. The effects of the shock were felt by his party, but none were at all seriously affected.

A number of them were badly soaked by the rain. Mr. H. H. Robinson and his party could not get the top up because of the storm, and every one of them was drenched to the skin. At Woodstock they had to buy shoes, etc., to get them to London.

The car driven by Mr. W. K. Bush was also caught in the rain, and four well-soaked young fellows arrived at the Teutonic House as the result of their experience.

"We have had a most pleasant trip," said Mr. H. H. Robinson, secretary of the tour. "The weather yesterday was the only bad bit we have struck, and, believe me, it was quite a storm. However, we managed to come through all right."

A number of the visitors were entertained at the Travellers' Club in the evening. A fine programme of music and speeches were given. Mr. Cecil Dwight-Edwards rendered several songs in admirable style.
