# ELECTIONS MUST! BE KEPT CLEAN

London, Aug. 6.—A Bill has been introduced in the House of Commons to prevent the indirect influencing of parliamentaries by candidates and members of parliament, by means of subscriptions to certain religious, charitable, public or semi-public institutions or enterprises. The Bill would include all such payments in the candidates election expenses—a return of which he has to make under the present law. Payment of subscriptions to clubs or societies of which a candidate is a bona fide ordinary member would be excepted, provided they did not exceed \$500 a year, while contributions to any fund or organization, which is exclusively political, are also expressly omitted from the scope of the measure. The law against corrupt practices at elections in the British Isles is already very strict, and any expenditure beyond that specially permitted by law invalidates an election. There is a feeling, however, particularly among the candidates themselves, that the cost of securing election and holding a seat is excessive, and it is with a view of cutting this down that the present measure has been proposed.

# ANOTHER MURDER IN THE SHARP CASE

Eupora, Miss., Aug. 5.—Walker Permenter, brother of Swinton Permenter, once convicted and later granted a new trial on the charge of killing Miss Janie Sharp, July 22, 1910, at Louisville, Miss. was shot and killed from ambush in the yard of a relative's home here last night. Young Permenter arrived on Saturday to accompany his brother to Winona, where Swinton's second trial is scheduled to open to-day. His death is the second during the progress of the case, which has become famous in the legal annals of Mississippi. Detective Walker was recently shot and killed at his home after he had brought a former neighbor of the Sharps back from Texas under the claim that he had evidence to connect his prisoner with Miss Sharp's death. Clues of the slayers of both men are lacking.

The funeral which has been fixed for August 14th. The date of the funeral service at Tokyo has been fixed for September 13th, the interment is to take place at Momoyama on September 14th.

# ONE KILLED AND TWO INJURED IN C. P. R. COLLISION

St. Catharines, Ont., Aug. 4.—Engineer Joseph Muldoon was almost instantly killed, Fireman F. Keller had his leg broken and Train Dispatcher W. J. McCutcheon sustained serious injuries in a rear end collision on the Canadian Pacific Railway, Montreal-Toronto line at Tweed early this morning.

Muldoon and Keller were on the engine of an eastbound freight which ran into another freight standing on the main line at Tweed. McCutcheon had just left his work at Tweed and boarded the standing train. Twelve cars were demolished and the engine of the eastbound freight badly smashed.

# GERMAN BANKERS' RESPONSIBILITY

The Supreme Court of the Kingdom of Prussia has just decided for the first time the question of responsibility of bankers for misstatements regarding the financial standing of concerns through which customers are induced to invest and here by lose their money.

The case in point had occupied the lower courts for years, with findings in favor of the great Schenckhausche Bank, which had been sued by shareholders in a delinquent leather manufacturing company, who declared that they had been induced to invest by means of statements made by the defendant bank in the prospectus offering the shares to the public.

The Imperial Court of Berlin nullified the findings, but the Supreme Court's found the statements in the prospectus to be untrue and condemned the bank to pay the plaintiffs' claims in full, with costs.

The main points of the Supreme Court's decision are: "The parties from whom the prospectus emanated, or they who circulated it, are liable for the damages of the persons who purchased the securities, provided they knew or knew of the incorrectness, or might have known such, if they had not been guilty of negligence." It was also held that the omission of important facts made the defendants equally liable.

# ROMAN VILLA UNEARTHED NEAR HENLEY, ENG.

London, Aug. 5.—The Daily Graphic says that a particularly fine example of a Roman villa has been unearthed near Henley, on the Thames. From the spaciousness and luxury of equipment of the house and out-buildings, it is clear that it was the dwelling of a Roman of wealth and refinement. Within the high walls surrounding the estate were fish ponds and a private well. A bath with water pipes and a bracket holding washing utensils are still remaining, as well as apparatus for heating the house. The building contained some beautifully designed tessellated floors, and some oyster shells were found. The date of the villa is about 100 A. D., and was discovered under a corn field.
