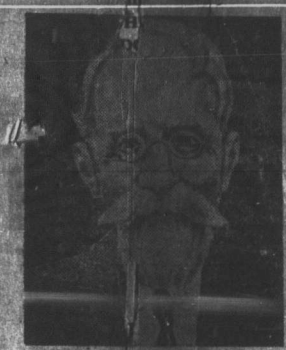

## SUDDEN DEATH OF CHATHAM MAN

George Stothart Expires in His Sister's Home Sunday

Chatham, Dec. 23.—Mr. George Stothart died suddenly Sunday. He went to Ferry Road on Sunday afternoon to the home of his sister, Mrs. F. E. Carruthers, and fell dead five minutes after his arrival there. Mr. Stothart was in his 63rd year, and is survived by his wife and three children, Mrs. J. C. Pincock, Winnipeg; Miss Jessie, superintendent of the Vancouver General Hospital, and Hazel at home. He is also survived by one brother, Robert, Ferry Road, and two sisters, Mrs. F. E. Carruthers, Ferry Road, and Mrs. Susan Bridges, Chatham. As a member of the Town Council and secretary of the School Trustees he has been identified with most of the public movements of the past. He was an active member of St. Andrew's church. At the time of his death he was one of the church trustees. Mr. Stothart was an assessor for several years. His loss will be felt in many lines of endeavor.

## DARING HOLD-UP

Highwayman Enters G.T.R. Ticket Office at Buffalo and Gets Away With \$327.

Buffalo, N. Y., Dec. 23.—Within sight of scores of people, a highwayman at 5.15 o'clock this afternoon held up two clerks in the city ticket office of the Grand Trunk Railway and succeeded in getting away with \$327.

Joseph E. Edward, chief clerk, and Harold D. Mowry, a stenographer, were behind the desk when the man walked in. Drawing a revolver, he threatened to kill them if they made an outcry. He then walked behind the counter and ordered Edwards to open the cash drawer. When the drawer was opened the stranger gathered up all the bills in sight and fled.

The ticket office is on the ground floor of Elbow Square. The counter where the men stood is visible from both Main street and the court of the big office building.

## FOUR SAILORS DROWNED

Died by N. S. Dec. 25.—Word came today from Yarmouth announcing the arrival there of the ship schooner "Dorothy M. Smart," which her flag at half mast for the loss of four of her crew, Frank Daley, Jesse Halliday, Loran McWhinnie and Stewart Robinson. They were washed overboard on Saturday's storm. Daley and Halliday belonged to Digby, McWhinnie's home was at Lower Granville, and Robinson's at Parker's Cove. Joseph Hersey, who also was carried away by a sea, was lucky enough to be washed back aboard the vessel.

## WAR AGAINST MORPHINE

Craze for Drug Reaches Terrible Proportions in Paris.

Paris, Dec. 23.—A general investigation into the illicit sale of morphine in Paris will be made as a result of the death here yesterday from the use of the drug of Rene Bichet, a young man who recently was appointed professor of French in the Royal College at Budapest. The authorities are convinced that aggressive campaign must be waged in order to combat the growing craving for morphine in Paris.

The vice is said to be at its worst among the young women frequenters of the night cafes and dance halls in the Montmartre district and in the Latin quarter. The police are in possession of astounding statistics relative to the spread of morphine habit. The newspapers claim the craze for the drug has reached terrible proportions in the higher Normal College of which Jean Bourget, who is charged with having hypodermically administered the drug to Bichet, is a student. Bourget is charged with homicide by imprudence. The police will try to close up pharmacies which are selling morphine in violation of the law.
