

From the Coral Rbom opens a small passage with an alcove containing a "fairy bridal attar," and partly barred by what looks like portices beautifully draped. Just beyond there is a miniature Grecian theater of antique pattern with a little stage all set for a play.

In the next chamber the visiting tourist beholds the semblance of a great pipe organ seventy-five feethigh. Its pipes, of course, are stail-actites, which, when struck with the coth-wrapped end of a stick, give forth different notes, tuneful and suggesting chimes.

Liberty Hall is 150 by 80 feet, and in the middle is the Liberty Column, an enormous stalagmite fourteen feet in diameter which is beautifully reflected in a quiet pool of water acits base. Yet another chamber, of even greater size, 300 feet in diameter, is called the Amphitheatre, oval in shape and with a dome-like ceiling 150 feet high.

Other curiosities are the Echo

Other curiosities are the Echo Chamber, the Cypress Swamp (with counterfeit pond lilines) and the Parachute chamber, in which two immense white parachutes seem as if hanging from aloft.

"Niagara in Winter" looks like a frozen cataract. The Vegetable Garden exhilits beets, turnips, carrots, parsnip, new potatoes, etc., all neatly executed in stone. In one chamber is a curtain of what looks like Japanese art carving, most elaborate. The so-called Madonna resembles a statue of the Virgin and Child. "Navajo blankets," hung from aloft, are woven by nature in varied colors; and in one of the caves there is even a sigantic angel's wing, feathery and exquisite.

The entrance to these wonderful caves is six miles west of the little town of Baker, Nevada. Tourists are beginning to go there in flocks. All around them is green and beautiful country, with trout streams full of fish; and close by is a little ranchhouse, where folks can get waffles and chicken if they are hungry. There is also an outdoor camp, with stoves, etc., ready for use by anybody who happens to come along.
