The fall sittings of the county court and general sessions of the peace for the county of Lambton opened in Sarnia before His Honor County Judge MacWatt on Tuesday, Dec. 11, and closed on Wednesday, effections. day afternoon.

On Tuesday the grand jury brought in rue bills in the following cases: The King vs. Jane Simpson—Theft. The King vs. Mrs. D. Armstrong.—

The King vs. A. D. Armstrong.—Indecent assault. Defendant in this case not being ready for trial, it was laid over

The trial of Mrs. Jane Simpson, who was charged with stealing shirt waists and other articles from the store of Geddes Bros. last spring, occupied the attention of the court Tuesday afternoon. The accused was defended by J. R. Logan. The jury, after a prolonged absence, brought in a verdict of guilty, with a recommendation for mercy. Judge MacWatt severely lectured the prisoner and allowed her to go on suspended sentence. The case against Mrs. D. Armstrong was, after hearing evidence, practically taken from the jury by His Honor, the judge, and a verdict of not guilty, recorded.
