On the other hand, there is not a single testimony, a lonely voice in favor of the Press which cannot be turned to the benefit of Free Education, for all true liberties—not licence—are so closely united that if you destroy one, all others must follow. Respect them all or none for they have the same origin . . . Justice Uncreated. Let there be a decree promulgating the State's exclusive right to teach and she will have to get an exclusive Press, an exclusive religion and an exclusive everything. It were quite logical for a Catholic State, guided by an Infallible Hand, to have a State Religion, a State Press and a State Educational system but absurd would it be for a Government of Free Thinkers to proclaim with a loud voice the Liberty of Conscience, the Freedom of the Press and at the same time to monopolize Education.
