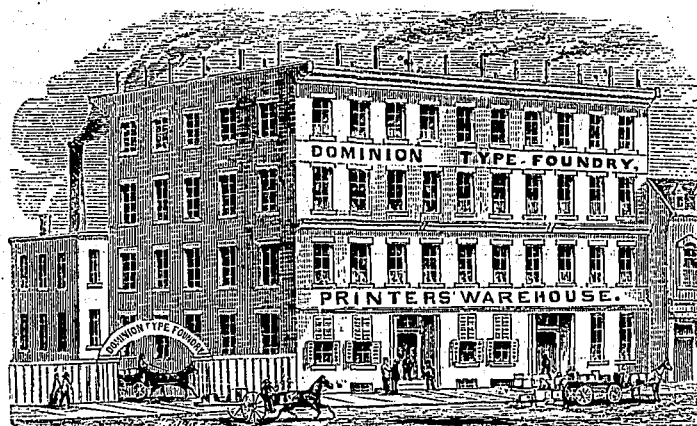

It is the intention of the Company to increase the efficiency of the Foundry, not only as regards facility and cheapness of manufacture, but in the beauty, durability and style of the Type produced. A new series of Roman faces, of a uniform and standard cut, is in preparation, together with a series of Old Style letters, from Nonpareil to Double Pica. The adaptability of these for Pamphlet, Book, and Insurance work, will commend them to the favor of the Trade.

A large variety of new Job Letter is also in hand, and will be offered to the Printer at lower prices than Type of foreign manufacture.

The metal used has been materially improved in its composition, and for tenacity is unsurpassed. Comparison is invited with the production of any other Foundry.

Arrangements have been made with the best English makers for the supply of Printing Presses, and other machinery, and it is believed that Printers, Bookbinders and Lithographers will find it more advantageous to order from the Company than to import direct.

Mr. C. T. PALSGRAVE, for many years proprietor of the Foundry, is connected with the new Company; and the services of Mr. H. LANNING, formerly Agent at Toronto, have been retained.
