

international customs forms are currently free of duty. Thus, is it unlikely that the Free Trade Agreement between Canada and the United States would have a significant impact on trade in these articles. However, the Free Trade Agreement may have considerable impact on trade in other products such as manifold business forms (5.3% duty), and certain printed calendars (4.4 cents/kg duty). Provisions in the Agreement will eliminate tariffs in five equal stages by January 1, 1993 with the exception of three articles which became duty free January 1, 1989. These articles are newspaper supplements printed by a gravure process, globes and vitrifiable decalcomanias. A complete listing of tariffs is found in Appendix 6.

Appendix 4A contains a further breakdown of U.S. imports from 1983-1988 for the following specific products within the Schedule A product groups mentioned above.

- Printed catalogues, chiefly U.S. products, except foreign authorship (TSUSA 2705000; Schedule A 8928780).
- Maps, atlases and charts, except tourist, etc. literature (TSUSA 2733500; Schedule A 8921340).
- Labels, flaps, and bands, nes* , lithographically printed in metal leaf (TSUSA 2742900; Schedule A 8928100).
- Labels, flaps, and bands, nes, metal leaf lithographically printed (TSUSA 2743300; Schedule A 8928100)
- Manifold business forms on paper not over 0.020 inches thick (TSUSA 2747540; Schedule A 8928760)
- Manifold business forms, nspf ** (TSUSA 2749020; Schedule A 8928780).
