Negotiating With Australians

Canadians will find it easier to negotiate with Australians than with most other nationalities in the Asia-Pacific region.
Canada and Australia have similarly structured economies, relatively small but highly concentrated populations, and rugged terrain that has demanded a focus on transportation and telecommunications.
Both countries have similar colonial experiences, Commonwealth ties, British legal and political institutions, high standards of living, and a multicultural society that includes aboriginal peoples and individuals who originated from virtually every part of the globe.
