Mr. Harris (Grey-Bruce) then moved,—That Bill No. 393, An Act to readjust the Representation in the House of Commons, be referred to the Special Committee appointed to consider the results of the census of 1951 and the readjustment of the representation in the House of Commons necessitated thereby, with instructions to prepare schedules to contain and describe the several electoral districts entitled to return Members to this House of Commons.
