CONCURRENCE

The House proceeded to consider certain resolutions reported from committee of supply.

Resolutions concurred in.

WAYS AND MEANS

SUPPLY BILL

Hon. J. A. ROBB (Minister of Finance) moved that the House go into Committee of Ways and Means.

Motion agreed to, and the House went into committee, Mr. Johnston in the chair.

Mr. ROBB moved:

Resolved that towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty for the fiscal year ending 31st March, 1928, the sum of \$234,934,632.06 be granted out of the consolidated revenue fund of Canada.

Motion agreed to.

Resolutions reported and concurred in. Mr. Robb thereupon moved for leave to introduce Bill No. 340, for granting to His Majesty certain sums of money for the public service of the financial year ending March 31, 1928.

Motion agreed to and bill read the first and second time.

Mr. ROBB moved:

That the said bill be now read a third time.

Hon. HUGH GUTHRIE (Leader of the Opposition) moved:

That all the words after "that" in the motion be struck out and the following substituted therefor, namely:

The bill be now read a third time but that it be referred back to the committee of the whole with instructions to the said committee that it have power to reduce vote No. 467 schedule C, by the sum of \$475,000.

This matter was discussed when a similar motion was made in the committee last night. I do not need to repeat what was then said; I simply wish to have the opinion of the House taken in regard to it.

Right Hon. W. L. MACKENZIE KING (Prime Minister): I am prepared to follow the example of my hon. friend, and to say, I do not think it is necessary to add anything to what was said last night, and I hope the House will vote on this amendment as emphatically as it did in the committee.

The House divided on the amendment (Mr. Guthrie) which was negatived on the following division:
